**H**ave you ever been to London? If you have, have you ever rood the “Underground”?

The “Underground” is London’s version of the Metro or New York Subway. It is world renowned and holds somewhat of a nostalgic place in the heart of Londoners. After all, during the Blitz of WWII, it is where many an Englishmen spent the night keeping them safe from Nazi Bombers and Buzz Bombs.

## Mind the GAP!!!!

*From the Council President*



I bring this up because it is my understanding that when a train pulls into the station and begins to off load and load passengers, the conductors walk the platform and remind passengers to “Mind the GAP!!!” The “Gap” is the space between the threshold of the door of the train and the platform. It is what passengers must step across in order to board the train and missing could cause serious injury. Although the physical gap is not unique to the London Underground, the phrase “Mind the GAP!!!” has become almost the unofficial safety motto to the Londoners.

What is my point? Well, two months ago, I wrote of the need for the congregation to be good stewards of God’s funds. Our revenue was not tracking our budget needs. The council, Elders, and especially Pastor and staff, began to institute several programs to reduce our expenditures. This meant keeping lighting usage to a minimum, reducing paper and office expenses, using volunteers to mow the lawn, and making due without some items or expenses. We began to track our expenses and compare them to the revenue that came in. This tracking is our “Gap!!!”.

Three months ago, we were tracking a gap of about \$5000 with a trend to have a financial shortfall of about \$20,000 at the end of the year. If that trend would have continued, we would have had to dip into our reserves by the end of the year to pay our bills and expenses. Council determined that this was unacceptable and determined to implement our stewardship measures. I am proud to say, that our Gap is now down to just under \$2000 and the trend is

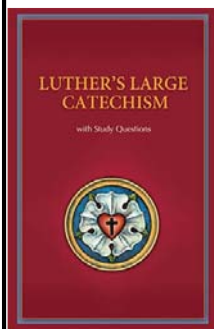



## OUTREACH

**R**eformation Fair is sneaking up on us and will be here before you know it, Saturday, October 30. We had about 200 attendees last year and are hoping to more than double that this year and will need everyone's help.

The Fair is a celebration of history and theology of this dynamic period, set in the year 1521, soon after Protestantism was born out of Martin Luther's 95 Theses. We celebrate and educate by creating a German Saxony village, dress in period costume, provide entertainment in the form of plays and music, Renaissance style food, period games such as javelin throw and jousting as well as more modern fun like a dunk tank and moonbounce for the kids. We also will have vendors selling wares of the period and lots of fun for everyone!

In the coming weeks we will be seeking lots and lots of volunteers to help us make this happen. ## PROPERTY COMMITTEE

### Some quick notes from the Property Committee:

- ◆ The two buildings have passed the annual Fire Marshall's inspection. Thanks to all that helped with the repairs needed to bring us into compliance.
- ◆ The new roof has failed and GAF has taken samples to be tested. A representative of GAF has submitted a claim for 100% replacement at full retail. We are waiting on the results of that submission and hope to be able to upgrade the quality of the shingles if the full claim amount is awarded. In the meantime, they supervised repairs to the spots where the shingles have come off. There should be no cost to us for the materials and labor if the claim is awarded.
- ◆ Volunteers to open and close the church for IEPV are needed on Sunday afternoons. There is a signup sheet on the bulletin board with the times.
- ◆ The Federal Communications Commission changed the frequency allocation that our wireless microphones operated on to be for emergency responders. We purchased a new lapel microphone in the still allowed frequencies for Pastor and we are hard wiring a microphone at the pulpit.
- ◆ I am looking for volunteers for a Garden Club to take care of the plantings around the church.
- ◆ Volunteers to mow, edge and trim the property are still needed. Again, there is a signup sheet on the bulletin board.
- ◆ The property committee has been tackling the long list of repairs. If you notice anything that needs our attention, please fill out the maintenance request form in the notebook at the bottom of the mailbox area.

While church leadership and elders have key roles in managing change/conflict, every member must help. We are all together the body of Christ - believers by grace for the purpose of serving His people, and advancing the kingdom. We are all saints and we live in anticipation of a joyous eternal life in God's perfect world. Wow!

So why aren't our fellowships or meeting always loving, harmonious joyous gatherings? The answer is simple. We are still in the flesh. The battles continue between our spiritual self and our sinful nature. St. Paul speaks in frustration when he says. "I do not understand my own actions. I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate! I have the desire but not the ability". There it is-life according to our sinful nature: enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, and divisions. **How do we counter this?**
